

2. Does your name have any special meaning?

Well, I am not sure. I guess there is something special about it, but I never asked my grandpa this question. He is the person who gave me my name. Well, I don't know. It's just a very common girl name. Actually, I was somewhat annoyed back in high school. People always mistook me for another girl in my class who had exactly the same name.

3. Why do some people change their name?

To be frank, I don't know why but I can only assume that they are not very happy with their names given by others. They want to be in control of everything in their life.

12. What are the advantages of studying instead of working?

When studying, I only had to worry about my exams. But now, I have to worry about my unpaid bills, my mortgage and my children's exams.

19. Do you agree that there should be a world language for everyone?

Yeah, I can't agree more. I really feel it's a huge waste of time to learn a second language from other country when we can work out a way for everyone to speak the same language. I think Esperanto is a great idea.

Describe your favorite food. Jiaozi (Chinese Dumpling)

I am going to say something about Cihnese dumpling, or Jiaozi in Chinese. Jiaozi (Chinese Dumpling) is a very traditional Chinese Food, which is essential during holidays like Chinese New Year especially in Northern China.

It is a very delicious food. You can make a variety of Chinese dumplings using different fillings based on your taste and how various ingredients.

Usually when you have Chinese dumpling for dinner, you will not have to cook anything else. The dumpling itself is good enough for dinner. This is one of the advantages of Chinese dumpling over other foods, though it may take longer to make them.

Making dumplings is really teamwork. Usually all family members join the work. Someone makes the filling; someone makes the dough and others roll skins. I am very good at rolling skins, which is the trickiest part. It is a lot of fun. Relatives catch up things when they are making dumplings. Children run all around, shouting and playing with each other.

Recipes

There are several stages. The first one is to make the dough. Put flour on a clear surface in a heap and pour water into it until it makes a flexible dough. Then you have to knead it for a while until it flexible and not too sticky. Then you go to the second stage which is to prepare the filling. It's quite variable but usually finely minced pork and leek or whatever green vegetable is available. You have to chop the filling ingredients very fine on a chopping board. And

then you mix the vegetable well into the pork. Next, you go on to rolling out the skins. This is the tricky part. It's best to get them pretty thin and roll out rough circles. The next move is to fill in dumpling. You only put quite a small amount of filling on the dough and then fold together the edges of the skin to form a half moon shape, and press the edges well together. It's important to seal the edges well because otherwise the Jiaozi may lose their filling when you cook them. And the last stage is to cook them, or more precisely, to boil them in the water. When the dumplings float on the water, just scoop up them. And ready to eat. Don't forget to have a dip in the vinegar or whatever sauce you like.

Stuffed mushroom

This is a traditional German home dish. The main ingredients are medium-sized mushroom, pork and veal mince. Usually half pork and half veal, or as you like. If you can't get them minced, of course, you have to buy the meat and mince it yourself. Then you peel and finely chop an onion and a couple of ginger slices. Put the meat, onion and gingers in a bowl, add a spoon of soy sauce, 3 teaspoons of cornflower, a pinch of sugar, salt and pepper, and mix well. Then you wash the mushrooms and remove the stems. Fill the cavity of the mushrooms with the meat stuffing and mound the filling in the center. When that's done you melt some butter or other fat in an ovenproof dish and place the stuffed mushrooms in it. Cover the dish with a lid. Then bake in a moderate oven for 30 minutes. Then you remove the lid and bake the dish for another 15 minutes. As soon as you take the mushrooms out of the oven, you drain off the juices in the pan. Ready to serve.

Kung Pao Chicken

I am going to describe a very famous Sichuan dish called Kung Pao Chicken, which is one of my favourites. Actually this dish is so famous that it is not long popular in China, it's also highly recommended by many foreign friends I know. It tastes very delicious. If you prefer strong spicy taste, you will love it. The main ingredients are boneless chicken, red and green peppers, peanuts and chestnuts. This is how we usually cook Kung Pao Chicken. First of all, cut chicken into biteable pieces and then mix together with cornstarch, soy sauce and egg white in a bowl. Then in a separate bowl or plate, combine green peppers, chestnuts and celery and sit aside. The next move is to heat the wok by pour a teaspoon of peanut oil. Stir-fry the red peppers until they are lightly brown. Then add chicken and stir-fry until the chicken is almost cooked through. Add the vegetables too and stir-fry for a few minutes. Add a pinch of soy sauce and heat for a few minutes to combine the flavours. The last thing is to sprinkle the peanuts over. Ready to serve.

It is a very appetizing dish so it's better to enjoy eating it over rice. Kung Pao Chicken is pretty universal in the Chinese restaurants so people eating out are keen to order this dish.

Describe your favorite animal.

Dog

I love dog. Dogs are adorable animals. My dog's name is Darcy and he's a 2-year-old husky.

It's an interesting story how Darcy become one of the family. Just before my 22-year-old birthday, my friends asked me what I wanted. I said how I wish I could have a pet dog. I didn't take it serious because it was just a momentary thought and also it would could a fortune. But you know what, they chipped in and bought me a dog. And it's Darcy.

He is very energetic and smart. I have taught him a lot of tricks. He can play hide and seek. He knows how to fetch things if I tell him to. He does roll overs and can also stand on his hind legs. He wags his tail when he is happy. He always barks when somebody comes to the door. But sometimes he is over-friendly and throws himself to people.

Sometimes he is very naughty. I don't like it when I have to take him for a walk in the rain and then he jumps all over the sofa with his muddy paws. He loves to run and socialize with others. He is active as well. He is able to run tirelessly for miles. When I'm walking him, it looks as if he is walking me. He's so strong and quick that I feel I am all out, a good way to lose weight.

Describe your favorite animal. Kiwis

As you may or may not know, kiwi is the national bird of New Zealand - and sometimes New Zealanders themselves are known as 'Kiwis'. Now, while kiwis in the wild are a rare sight, the kiwi as a symbol is far more visible. Apart from being in toy stores and airport shops all over the world, you'll find them on our stamps and coins. The kiwi is the smallest member of the genus Apteryx which also includes ostriches and emu. It gets its name from its shrill call which sounds very much like this - kee-wee kee-wee. Kiwis live in forests or swamps and feed on insects, worms, snails and berries. It's a nocturnal bird with limited sight and therefore it has to rely on its very keen sense of smell to find food and to sense danger, Its nostrils are actually right on the end of its long beak which is one third of the body length. Now here's an interesting fact. Although kiwis have wings, they serve little purpose because the kiwi is a flightless bird. Since white settlement of the islands, kiwi numbers have dropped from 12 million to less than 70,000 and our national bird is rapidly becoming an endangered species. This is because they're being threatened by what we call introduced animals which were brought to New Zealand such as cats and ferrets which eat kiwi eggs and their chicks.

Describe your favorite animal. Giant Panda

I'd like to say something about our national animal - giant panda. Pandas are

famous for their black and white markings. The legs, shoulders, ears and oval patches around the eyes are black, and the rest of the coat is white. Pandas live in dense bamboo forests. They are good tree climbers and they can swim to escape predators. Different from the other bear species, the panda is the only herbivores in the family. Pandas feed mostly on bamboo but also eat flowers and even honey. Although it was once more widespread, today this rare species is limited to south-western China. The number of giant panda is decreasing mainly due to the loss of their natural habitat to the increasing human populations and periodic bamboo die-offs. Our government is taking efforts to save this kind of adorable animal.

Describe a game children play. The Eagle and the Chicks

I am going to describe a very interesting Chinese game I played in my childhood.

It is called 'The Eagle and the Chicks', which is a fun, easy to play and a perfect outdoor game for kids.

This game needs at least five kids to start, and the more kids participating, the more fun it would be. Choose a kid as the eagle and another kid as the mother hen. The rest of the kids will be the chicks. In the game, the eagle tries to catch the last chick in the line so he or she will be no longer the eagle, and the mother hen tries to protect the chicks from the eagle.

The chicks will line behind the mother hen one by one. The first chick behind the mother hen will hold on to her waist or cloth, the one behind the first chick will hold on the first, and so on. The eagle can catch the last chick by tagging, and the mother hen can protect the chicks by spreading her arms shoulder high.

When the chasing begins, the eagle is free to run anywhere to catch the chick. The mother hen will try to be in front of the eagle to protect the chicks.

The eagle has to bypass the mother hen to catch the last chick and he will try to avoid any contact with the mother hen. To help the mother hen, the chicks will try to run out of the way of the eagle. The chicks don't have to be in the line all the time. They may run out of the line and play tag with the eagle.

If the eagle catches the last chick, this round will be over and they switch roles for another round.

Rubber Band Rope Jumping

I'd like to say something about a game called rubber band rope jumping. Rubber band jumping was popular in my primary school which was only for girls. This game can help children to practice their jumping skills, develop coordination, and also meet lots of friends.

Rubber band jumping is a low cost game. We only need some rubber bands. We looped rubber bands together tightly until we had a larger one (One can select the length she likes). When we got three persons together, we could start our game. Here's how we played this special jump rope game. Two girls stood

opposite each other and extended the rubber band. One player jumped and stood on one side of the rubber band, carrying the two sides together. Then she jumped again and made the two sides separate. After that she jumped again into the middle of the rubber-band and after that she jumped outside it. If we finished these steps without any mistakes, we started the next level. As the game continued, the level of jumping got higher and higher. There were four jumping levels: ankle high, knee high, waist high, and under the shoulder. More and more girls tried to jump and we competed as teams. The game is fun. But it is kind of pity nowadays we very rarely see young girls playing this game.

Hopscotch

I want to say something about hopscotch, which I personally think is a pretty universal game around the world. Children always enjoy drawing grids on the sidewalk or on the ground and then jumping or hopping from one end of the grid to the other. I remember when I was a little boy, most afternoons I used to play hopscotch with my friends in our neighbourhood. There could be any number of players, which means I could even play by myself. But there were always more fun with more kids. A stone was the only object we needed to play it. First of all, someone drew on the ground rectangles or squares arranged side by side with a figure in it. To play this game, each player had to hop to the first rectangle, then to the second one and them to the third one and so on. After reaching the last number with the last grid, the player had to turn around still on one leg and hop back from the last number to the first one. While hopping, the player must not step on the line between the rectangles, and must keep his balance. If, for instance, the player's other leg (the one which is lifted) touches the ground, the player then fails.

Describe an important city in your country. Shanghai

Geographic region

Lying at the gateway to the Yangtze River on the middle of China's East Coast, Shanghai is the largest economic and trade center, a comprehensive industrial base and the leading port in China, as well as a famous historical and cultural city with a total population of more than 16 million.

History

Shanghai used to be merely a small fishing village. After the first Opium War, the

British named Shanghai a trading port, forcing the city's opening to foreign involvement administered by the British, French and American independent of Chinese law. Each colonial presence brought with its own culture, architecture and society. Thus began a mixing of cultures that shaped Shanghai's openness to Western influence.

Climate

Shanghai has a delightful climate with four distinct seasons, generous sunshine and abundant rainfall. It belongs to the northern subtropical monsoon climate. The rainy season mainly come during the end of June and the early July. The weather is at its best in September and October, with a good chance of sunny days and mild temperatures. Winters can drop well below zero and summers are hot and humid with temperature as high as 40 centigrade. It very rarely snows here in Shanghai but the winter fog is quite frequent and the visibility in the morning can be rather poor.

Attractions

Shanghai is also a famous tourist destination with more than 300 tourist

attractions. The Bund, Yu Garden, Jade Buddha Temple, ancient pagodas and temples in ancient towns of Longhua have been always the major scenic spots in Shanghai for tourists from home and abroad. Relying on these traditional scenic spots, some large-scale festivities held during holidays, including the Bell-striking at Longhua Temple, the Temple Fair in Longhua, Shanghai Osmanthus Festival, Huangpu Tourism Festival and Open-air Concert on square,

have been attracting an increasing number of domestic and foreign tourists and enriching the cultural life of Shanghai residents because of their strong folk colors. In addition, a number of tourist attractions with modern flavor, like the Oriental Pearl TV Tower, Shanghai Museum, Shanghai Library, Shanghai Stadium and Shanghai Grand Theatre, were built in recent years.

Describe your hometown/your favorite city. Shanghai

Shanghai is one of the world's largest cities, and is in some ways more like New York than Beijing. Lying at the estuary of the Chang Jiang (Yangtse) River, it is the centre of China's trade and industry. Shanghai is a densely populated city with almost 16 million people. Like many other international cities, Shanghai is a cosmopolitan trading port, with people from different parts of the world living 38

and working together. I enjoy the urban lifestyle I lead here, and make the most of the superb amenities, ranging from the excellent shops to some of the best restaurants in the world. And as the city is expanding, there are a lot of building sites where new apartments are continually being built to deal with the urban sprawl and the

rural-urban migration of population.

Shanghai Museum is a must-see for foreign visitors to Shanghai. The new museum building was erected at the very center of Shanghai in September 1994

Its unique architectural form of a round top with a square base, symbolizing the

ancient Chinese philosophy that the square earth is under the round sky, is a distinguished architectural combination of traditional feature and modern spirit. The new Shanghai Museum has ten special galleries of bronze, calligraphy, ceramics, furniture, jades, minority art, paintings, sculpture, seal carvings, coins and arts and crafts.

Shanghai Museum has installed advanced security and fire alarm systems, educational services, a computerized library and an automation system. Besides this, Shanghai Museum has facilities for multimedia guide, an information center, a High Definition Graphics system, an audio tour, the lecture room equipped with a system of spontaneous interpretation.

Describe a museum. Museum of Anthropology

I just came from Vancouver and I must say I had a fantastic time. There's so much to see and do in the city. But if you get a chance to go there, there's one place you mustn't miss, and that 's the Museum of Anthropology. It was certainly one of the highlights of my time in Canada.

The museum was actually established way back in 1949 and these days it's one of the most popular in Canada. It's worth going there just to see the building, in fact, because it's stunningly modern and dramatic – it's hard to believe it was built back in 1976. One very good thing is that the museum's all on one floor, which makes it easily accessible for wheelchairs. Another plus is that it's in the most beautiful setting, overlooking the sea. (Beijing Courtyard/quadrangle: a compound with houses around a square courtyard)

A small or medium-size siheyuan usually has its main or only entrance gate built at the southeastern corner of the quadrangle with a screen wall just inside the prevent outside from peeping in.

A notable feature of the courtyard house is that the complex is fully enclosed by buildings and walls. There are no windows on the outside walls, and usually the

only opening to the outside is through the front gate.

Such a resident offers space, comfortable and quite privacy. It is also good for security as well as protection against dust and storms. Grown with plants and flowers, the court is also a sort of garden.

All the quadrangles, as product of feudal society, were built in accordance with a strict set of rules from their size and style one could tell whether they belonged to private individuals or the powerful and rich.

One of the most striking aspects of Chinese domestic architecture is the practice of making houses face south.

Describe an emblematic building Oriental Pearl TV Tower

The Broadcasting & Television Tower of Oriental Pearl is the world's third tallest TV tower after the 553-meter CN Tower in Toronto and the 535-meter Moscow TV Tower. It is situated in the Pudong New Area, facing off the classic beauty of the Bund. With a giddy height of 468 meters, the tower is Shanghai's landmark and a big magnet for tourists. Every visitor will undoubtedly be overwhelmed by its beauty.

The designers magically designed eleven beautiful spheres of various sizes and three big columns together to represent pearls (as in "Shanghai, Pearl of the Orient").

The sightseeing floor is 263 meters high and it is the best place to get a bird's eye-view of Shanghai. When it is sunny, it is really relaxed and happy to have the distant views of Shanghai. In the upper sphere, there are also the Revolving Restaurant, the Disco Hall, the Piano Bar and twenty KTV rooms. The Restaurant

revolves one circle an hour.
